

Frequently asked questions for Pre-1990 Care Leavers (Forgotten Australians)

Open Place transition to new service provider
Version 2 October 2019

The department refers to people who were institutional care as children before 1990 as Pre-1990 Care Leavers. The department acknowledges there are multiple ways people identify themselves, including 'Care Leaver' and 'Forgotten Australian'.

When will Open Place close?

Open Place will close in June 2020. The Department of Health and Human Services (the department) will work with Berry Street Victoria to support the continuation of services until then.

Will there still be a dedicated Victorian service for Pre-1990 Care Leavers?

Yes. The Victorian Government and the department remain committed to providing ongoing support in recognition of the lifelong impact of the care experience. A new service will be announced and established next year that will commence when Open Place closes.

The national service provided by the Care Leavers Australasia Network (CLAN) will continue to operate in Victoria.

Can I have a say about the new service?

Yes. It is important to the department to identify and establish the new service **with** Pre-1990 Care Leavers and key stakeholders. We would like to know what is important to you in the transition of this service.

How can I share my views?

The department is running a co-design process until the end of December 2019 that you can choose to be involved in.

This process means we would like to hear your thoughts about what you would like from support services. If you have used the services at Open Place, we would also like to know what you value about Open Place and what you would like to continue in the new service.

If you would like to provide more detailed information, you can let us know your views including your thoughts about:

- What support services (including at Open Place) do you currently access?
- What is good about these support services that doesn't need to change?
- What helps you feel understood by these services and by others?
- What are the qualities of a good service provider?
- What would you like to change in support services if you could?
- What support services and/or resources do you need that you don't currently get?

The following table provides information about these opportunities and how you can take part in them.

Telephone call to the department	<p>Pre-1990 Care Leavers can call 1800 319 520 (free call) between 9am and 1pm on working days.</p> <p>It may not always be possible for the phone to be immediately answered as we may be taking other calls. If this happens, you will be given the option to leave a message and someone will call you back as soon as possible. The person you speak with will ask you some questions about your views and write them down so they can be used in this process.</p>

You can use one or several of the methods in the table and can also use these methods to share anything you have created, such as artwork, that helps you to express how you feel.

What will the department do with the information provided by Pre-1990 Care Leavers?

We will ask for your consent when you engage in any of these activities, so we have your permission to use the information you provide. Any personal information you provide us (such as your email address) will be de-identified before further use. After the consultations, we will create a short report that captures everything you told us which will be used to help identify and develop the new service.

What else will the department use to identify and develop the new service?

We will draw on the nine years of experience and learnings from Open Place by talking to Open Place staff and people registered with Open Place to help identify and develop the new service.

The department will also use learnings from past inquiry reports such as:

- Forgotten Australians: A report on Australians who experienced institutional or out-of-home care as children
- Victorian Parliamentary Inquiry into the Handling of Child Abuse by Religious and Other Non-Government Organisations (Betrayal of Trust)
- Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse Final Report.

The department will also speak with other services both in Victoria and other states who provide support to Pre-1990 Care Leavers.

The department already ran a co-design process, why are you doing it again?

The department ran a similar co-design process in 2008 before Open Place started to help identify and develop that service. We learnt a lot from that process and are keen to know whether there is anything we could be doing differently to better meet your needs before we find a new provider.

Will the new service be the same as the Open Place service?

We are going to listen to what is working well and what could be improved in your current service. Any changes will be informed by what we hear from you in the consultations.

When will the new service start?

It is expected the department will begin work to identify a new provider in January 2020 and announce the new provider in March 2020. The chosen provider will then work with Pre-1990 Care Leavers and key stakeholders to establish the new service by the time Berry Street Victoria close Open Place in June 2020.
